## Delta Kappa Epsilon Experiences Historic Growth

ANN ARBOR, MI—Delta Kappa Epsilon International Fraternity announces that on November 17, 2021, its Board of Directors has granted charters to eight new chapters, representing the continued growth of our Fraternity, which was founded at Yale College in June, 1844.

Charters were awarded to chapters at the following Universities:

University of Arizona (reactivation of Omega Omega Chapter)  
Auburn University (reactivation of Delta Alpha Chapter)  
University of Colorado-Boulder (new Alpha Omicron Chapter)  
Cornell University (reactivation of Delta Chi Chapter)  
University of Mississippi (reactivation of Chi Chapter)  
Northeastern University (new Nu Alpha Chapter)  
Ohio State University (reactivation of Delta Tau Chapter)  
Texas Tech University (new Tau Gamma Chapter)

In addition, two new Associate Chapters were named, at the University of Washington, and Georgetown University.

Over the last several years, Delta Kappa Epsilon has witnessed a steady growth of interest in the starting of new chapters and the return of chapters to campuses where DKE had previously existed.

**This action represents the largest one-day expansion of the Fraternity's chapter roll in its 177 year history.**

This brings the number of active chapters to 55, and the number of associate chapters to 7, and we are in active conversations with groups at other fine universities.

Considering the pressures on college campuses created over the past 20 months by the Covid pandemic, we are cheered by the dedication of such outstanding young men across the land, and we look forward to working closely with them in the years ahead.
